Past District Governor Paul introduced our guest speakers Alison Stone and Sonya Enkelmann from the "Allstars Group", formally the Glenorchy City Council Children's Development Project. The children in the group were encouraged to come up with the new name and logo for the group through a competition. The new name and logo were launched at The Moonah Arts Centre at the end of Term Three.

The Allstars Group is a social development project for children aged from 6-12 years in the Glenorchy municipality. The project was developed to offer children after school activities as there was a lack of opportunities for children in the municipality. The group offers a broad range of activities for students from Moonah Primary, Glenorchy Primary, Goodwood Primary and Springfield Gardens. The project is not funded and relies on the generosity of volunteers who offer workshops for the children. Currently members from the Zen Do Kai, Exit Left and Glenorchy Football club groups volunteer to run activities for the children. More volunteers are needed to accommodate the 105 children currently in the program and the four new schools entering the project next year.

The AllStars group was founded on the principle that children with high levels of social development have greater success in life than those with lower levels. The project is the first of its kind in Tasmania and UTAS are interested in finding out how successful the project is, and is offering a full scholarship to BTeach undergraduates to research the effectiveness of the project.
